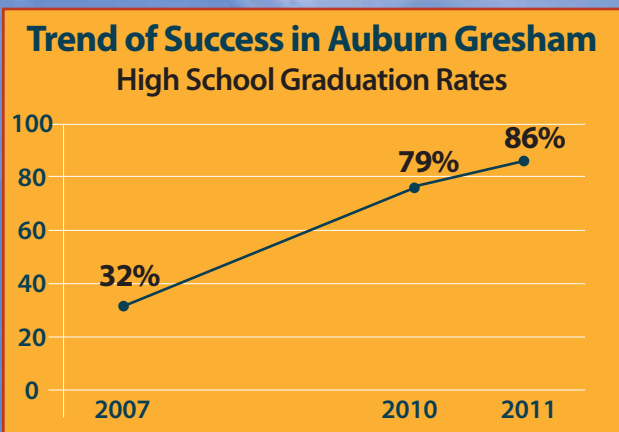

The remarkable success of our new schools in the Auburn Gresham neighborhood is a striking example of the Perspectives difference and how it is changing the trajectories of young lives.

Six years ago, Chicago Public Schools CEO Arne Duncan closed the underperforming Calumet Career Academy. Duncan, who is now U.S. Secretary of Education, gave Perspectives the green light to open two new high schools on that campus.



Before Perspectives came to Auburn Gresham, Calumet Career Academy had a 32% graduation rate.* Under Perspectives' leadership, graduation rates have skyrocketed in a mere five years—to 86%.** Not only are students earning high school diplomas at record rates, they are continuing on to college. Of Perspectives' Class of 2011 graduates in Auburn Gresham, 97% were accepted to college. "This fall, 93% of our graduates enrolled in college, nearly 90% of whom are the first in their families on track to earn a college degree," according to Perspectives cofounder Kimberlie Day. "Graduation rates continue to soar in Auburn Gresham because the Perspectives schools embrace **A Disciplined Life**®, ensuring a College for Certain outcome," says Adrienne Leonard, community activist and chair of the former Calumet Career Academy's Transition Advisory Council.

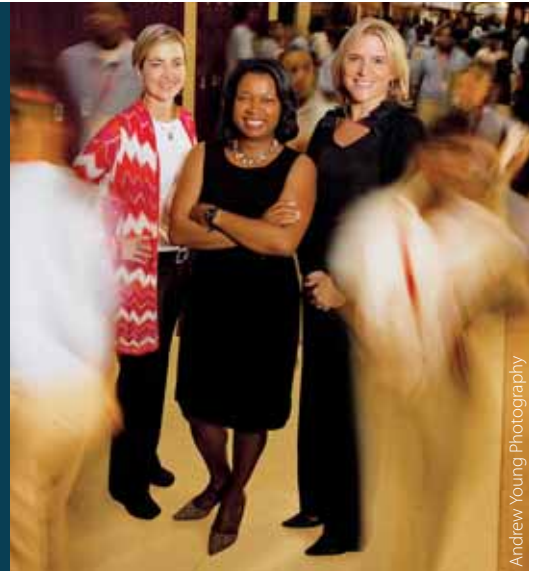
